Fr. Giulio Dalmaso was born in Pergine (Trento) on February 14, 1914, from Guglielmo and Luchi Basilia.

He entered the Institute and attended the Novitiate in the Holy Trinity Community, having as his Novice Master Fr. Angelo Pagliarusco.

On June 28, 1942, in middle of the world war, he was ordained a priest.

During his long life, he served in several communities.

In Udine, he served as professor of Literature (1942-1943); in the Stimate, as collaborator in the school secretary (1943-1944); again in Udine (1944-1945), as professor of Religion and collaborator in the St. Peter Martyr Church; in Sezano (1945-1946), as Economist; in the Holy Cross Parish in Milan, as collaborator in the first after-war year (1946-1947). He was transferred to Bellizzi (1947-1950) and, next, to Battipaglia (1950-1951), always as parish collaborator.

He returned to Udine (1951-1955) as professor of Religion and serving also in St. Peter Martyr Church. Again in Milan (1955-1958), he served as parish collaborator. He dedicated to the same ministry in Poggiomarino (1958-1959). He served longer in Trento (1959-1967) as economist, helping in the parish and high school. He served for ten years in Battipaglia as Parish Vicar (1967-1977).

At the total, he lived in the community in Udine for 31 years, among them as Economist for 13 years, until 1990. He dedicated his last years to the ministry service at St. Peter Martyr's.

The ailments due to the elderly age were more severe in his last years. However, Fr. Giulio never missed his joyful and playful spirit; at the contrary, he used to say very original phrases, never imagined before.

We will remember him as a total availability confrere in his uncountable transfers, and as an economist in constant endeavor with the numbers.

He was marked for his religious fidelity, that he always knew to reconcile with a permanent and well-known good humor, able to express with wisdom all the tension around the community and social life.

In the last days of his life he presented some disturbances. Afterwards a general deficiency attacked his heart, and at the night of September 30, assisted by his superior Fr. Pasquale Cavallo, the Lord called him home at age of 94.
